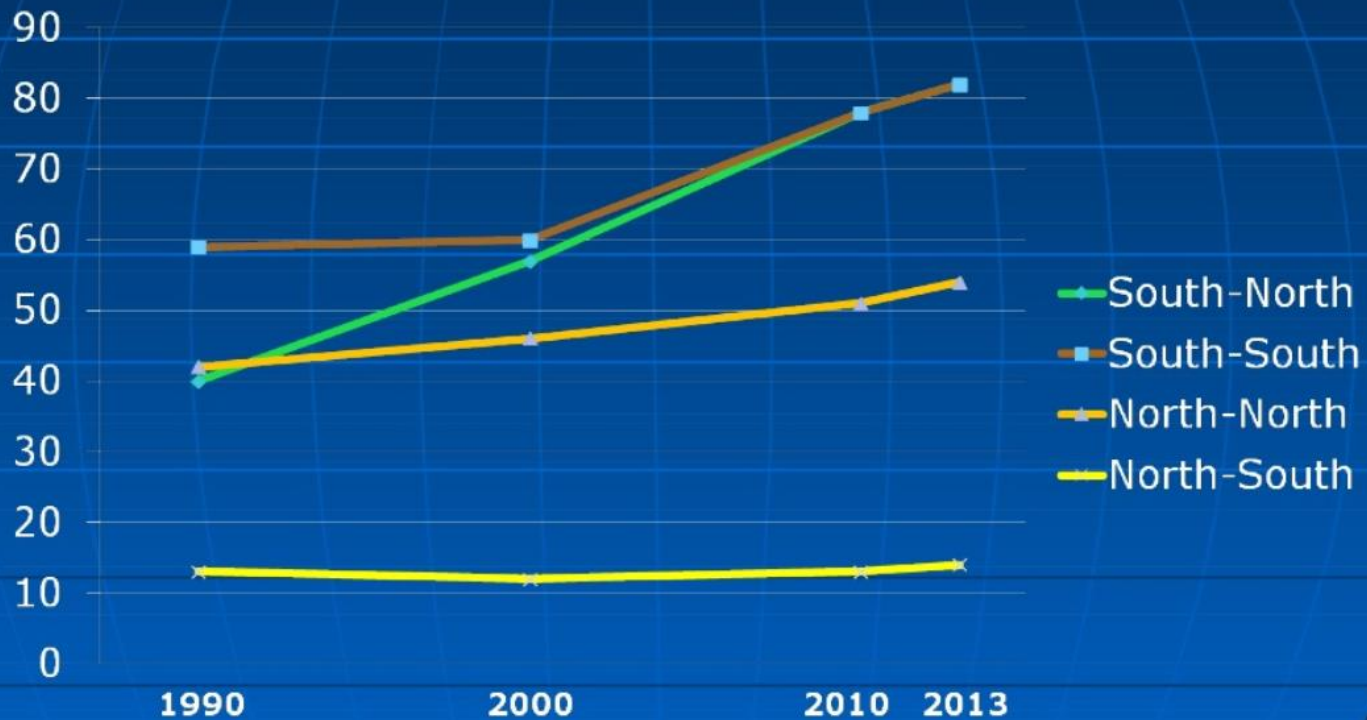

Numbers of international migrants by origin and destination, 1990-2013

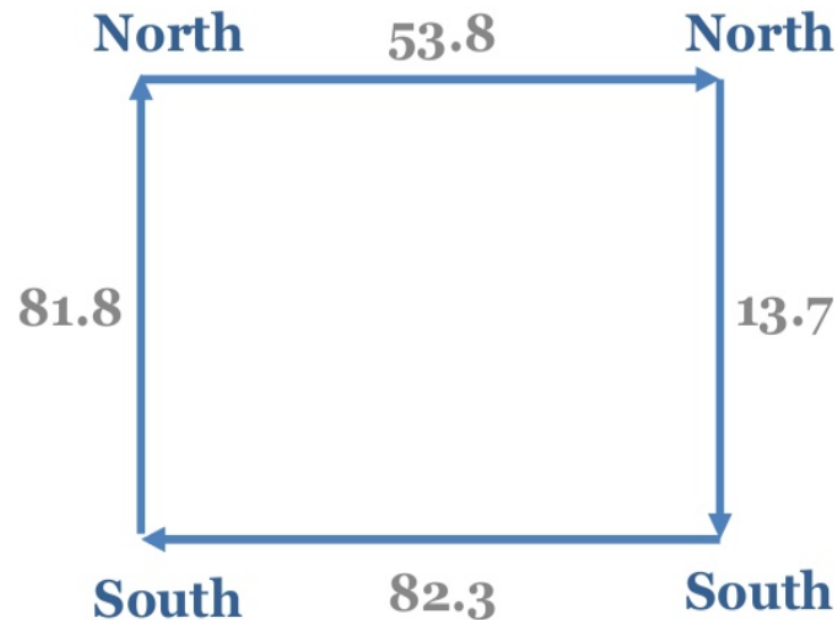

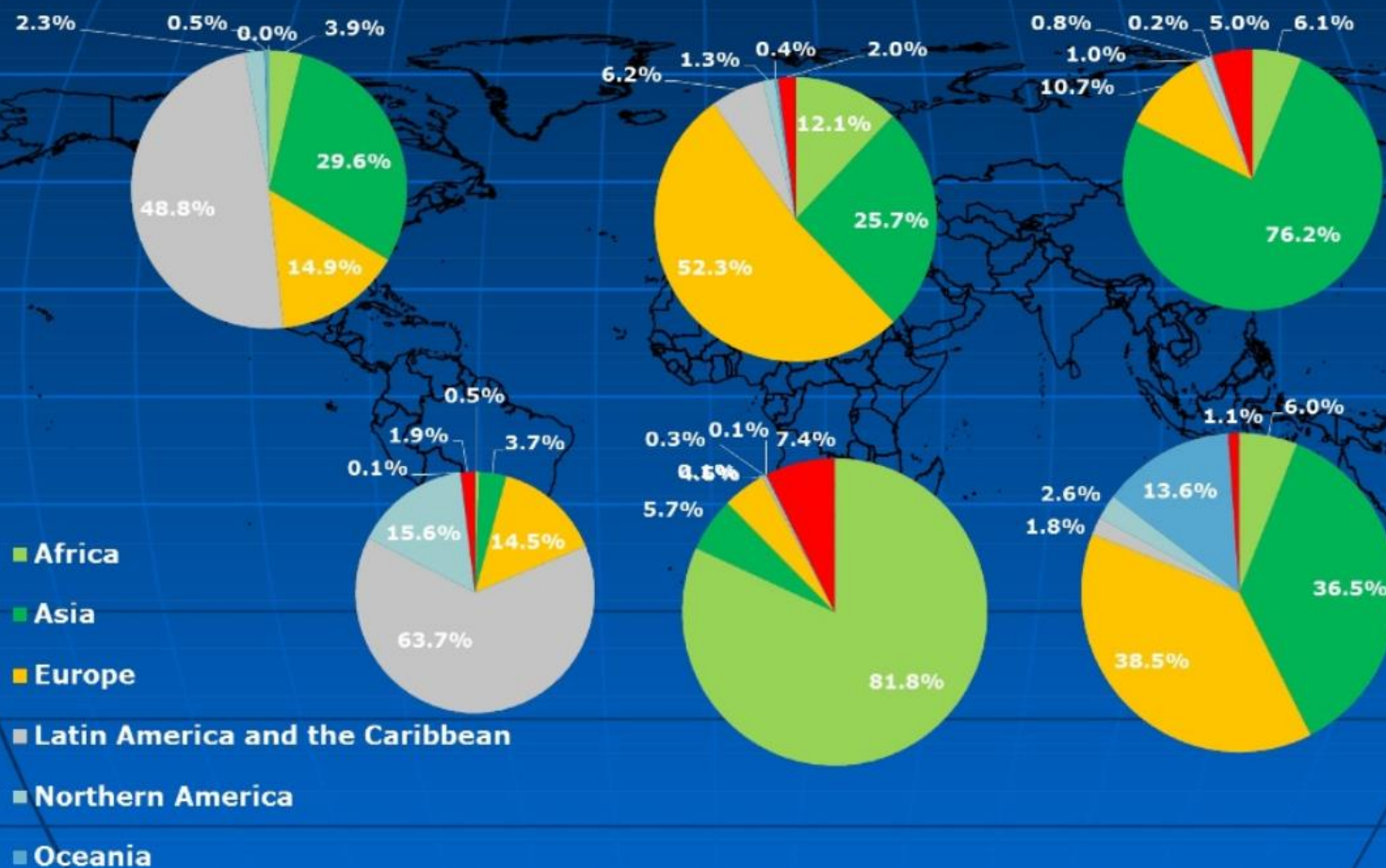
Patterns of migration stocks 2013 (in millions)

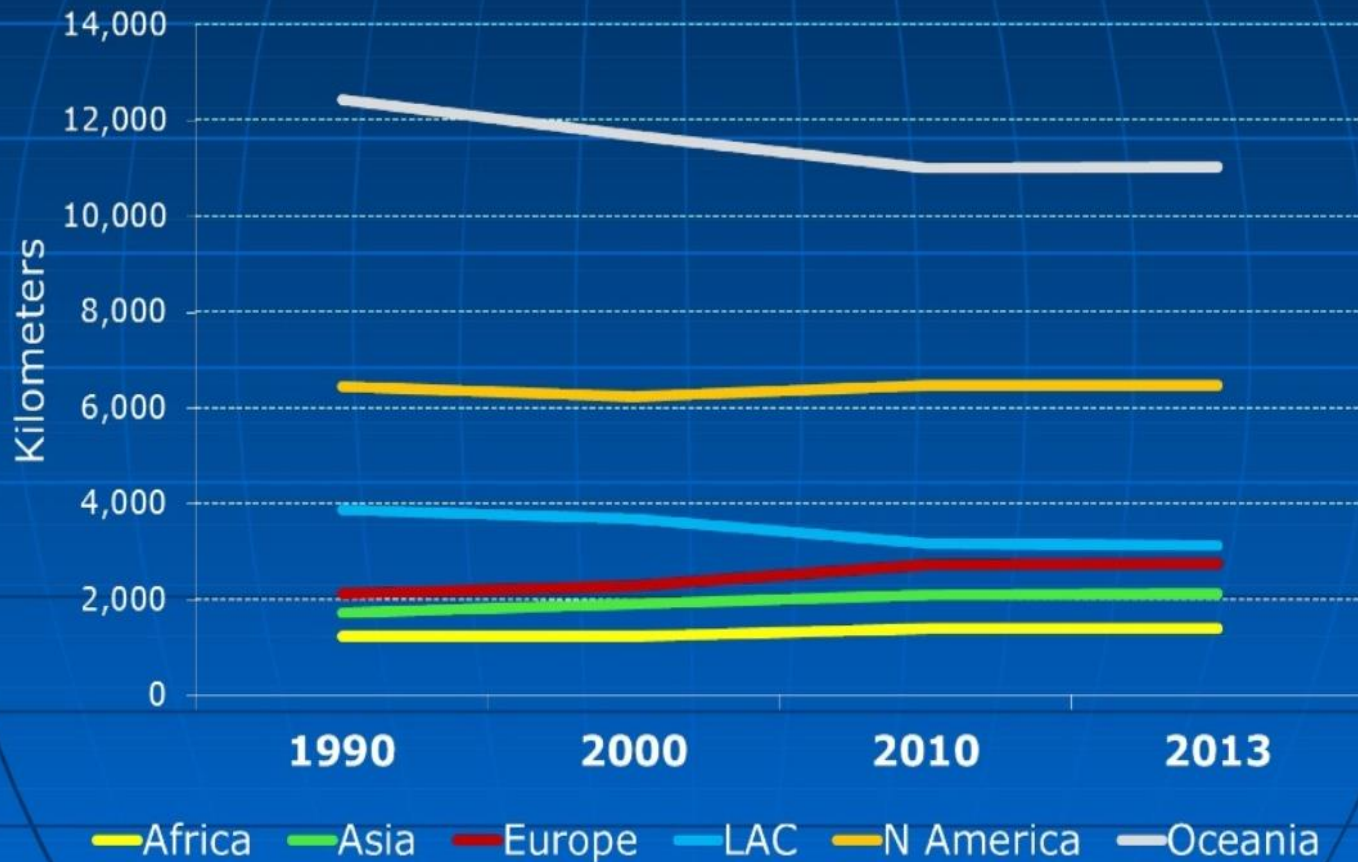

Migration distance is quite stable over time

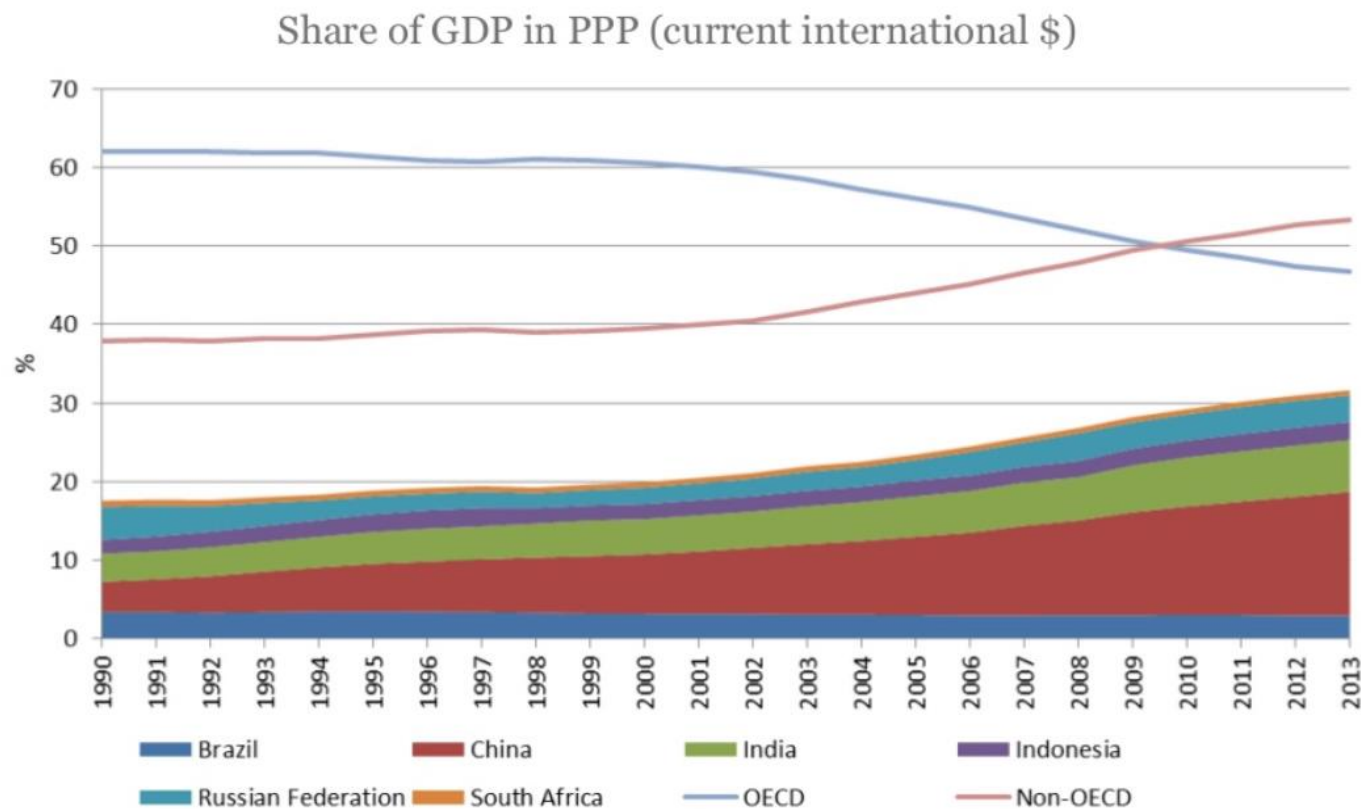


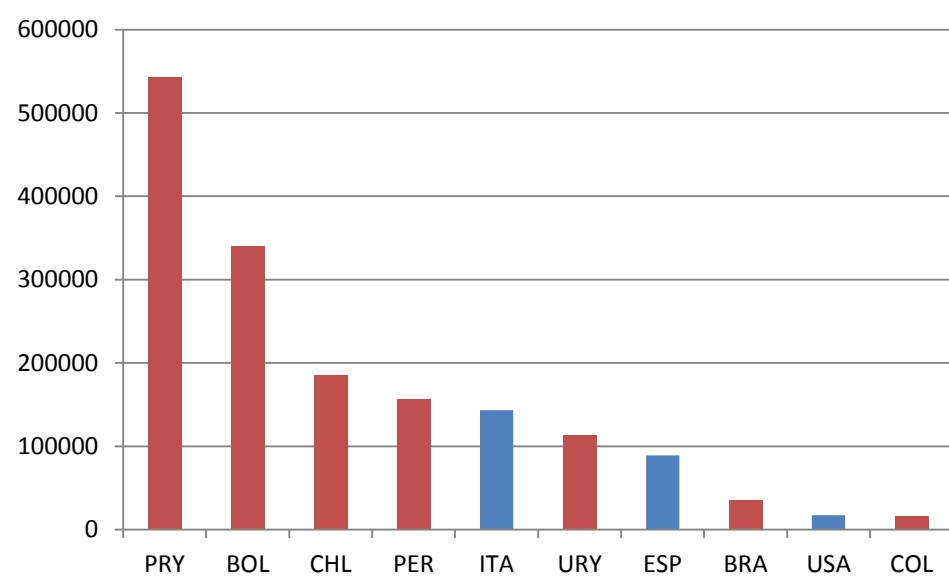

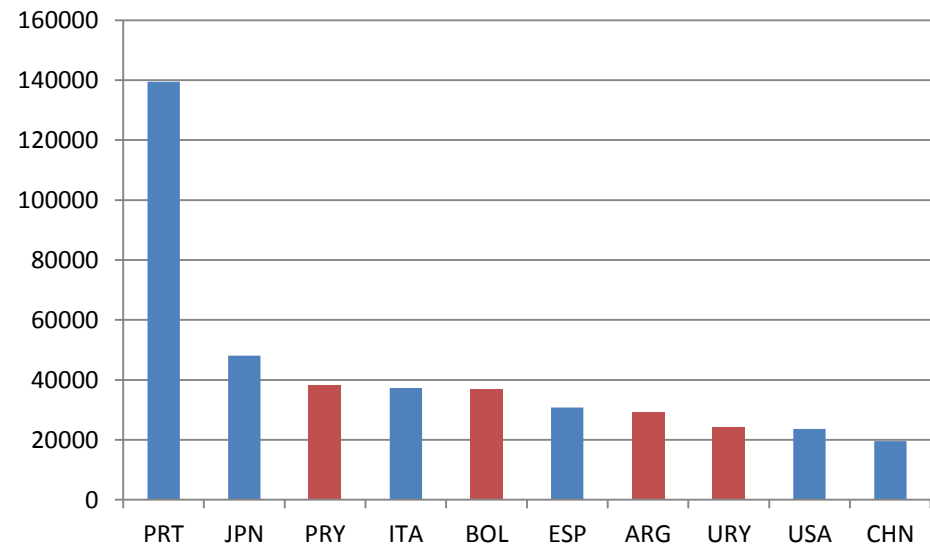

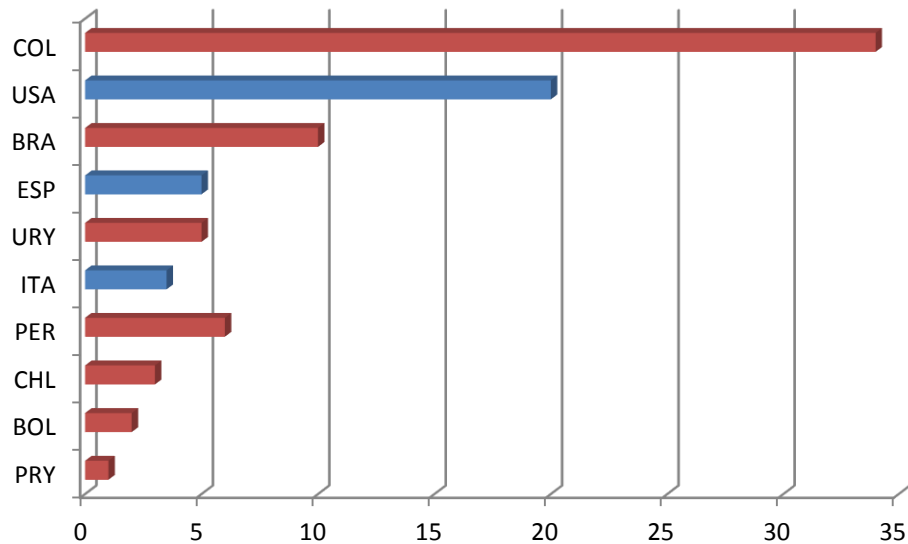

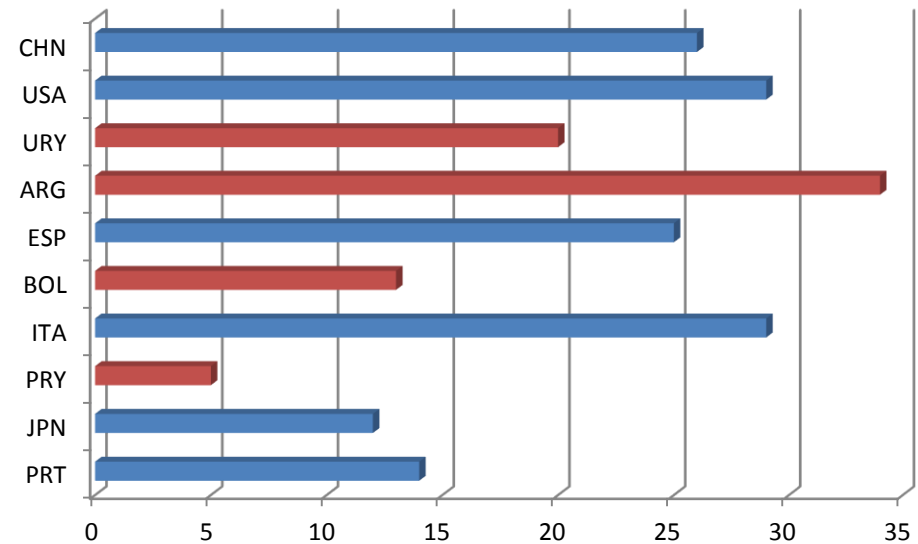
