

Code 1362. Migrants Integration and Settlement in Receiving Societies

Length/Duración: 90 minutes

This workshop covers experiences, challenges, and complexities in the integration and settlement of migrants and refugees in Europe, Middle East, and North America. The studies focus on a wide range of migrant populations, including Polish immigrants in the United Kingdom and the rationale for the forming of ethnic enclaves in contemporary cities, the Muslim minorities in France, Quebec, and English Canada and the contradictions they face in integration and multiculturalism policy, to experiences of displacement of millions of refugees from the war zones of the Middle East. The national and global policies addressing migration, integration, and resettlement are addressed by the papers.
